NOVEMBER MEETING... SILENT AUCTION

The November meeting to be held on Monday, November 13th will be the Annual Silent Auction.

The rules are:

1 – Auction Items:

- Bring all those flea market purchases to unload at our annual auction. This Auction is intended to get people to bring their Ham related items that they don't want any more and would like to try and sell them to others who may want them.
- Items with No Bids - There is a \$.50 charge for items with no bid with maximum charge of \$5.00 per person.

2 - Sellers:

- Each item must have a bidding sheet, which includes Seller call or name and a description of item. To set a minimum bid, place a bid of the minimum amount in your call/name.

3 - Items with Bids:

- The seller understands that N.S.R.A charges \$1.00 or 10% (which ever is highest) of the selling price.

4 - Bidders:

- All items have a minimum bid of \$2.00

- The NSRA is not responsible for anything of any items in the auction.

ARES/SKYWARN UPDATE...

The weather may have been relatively quiet over the past couple of months, but the North Shore ARES team leadership is still hard at work. Here is just a small representative sampling of what we have been up to:

- We have started a monthly discussion group using the North Shore ARES Yahoo group. During the month of September our discussion was about the use of backup net control stations, while the October discussion was about the use of "This Is" while checking in to a net.
- Final statistics were compiled regarding the May Floods of 2006. Across the region, 104 total amateurs participated providing at least 321 reports of flooding and rainfall measurements in Massachusetts alone. A total of 46 amateurs participated on the North Shore SKYWARN net, providing almost 60% of the 140 Local Storm Report entries. In total, Amateur Radio was responsible for almost 98% of reporting into NWS Taunton during the May Floods, based on the Local Storm Report.
- Special thanks to all for their assistance during the long and tiresome 2006 severe weather season. This includes the floods, May 21st Severe weather outbreak, and July 11th funnel cloud (which set off a Tornado Warning for Essex County, thanks to amateur radio spotters) and multiple microbursts in Marblehead. Pictures and articles from several of these events are still available online at www.nsradio.org, just by clicking on the SKYWARN Information link
- We have named two assistant AEC's to help us administer the ARES team. Gordon Gravelese, KX1KTY, has been named the Operations AEC, and will participate as a key team leader during our activations. Matt Dempsey, KB1MRH, has been named the Administrative AEC, working with us on the behind-the-scenes details. Special thanks to all and please give them the same support you have given us.
- The Annual Simulated Emergency Test, or SET, will be taking place on Saturday, November 4, from 10:00 A.M. to 1:00 P. M.. The scenario and other finer details of this drill have yet to be announced, but we look forward to having everyone participate in this exercise. The drill will take place on the 145.470 Danvers repeater and as always we will be looking for volunteers to assist with certain facets of the drill, such as liaison work, that will be announced once we get underway.
